Call for information and connection to services: 'One Door'...

- for children and youth under age 18 with emotional, behavioural, or developmental concerns
- for adults with a developmental disability



Who can call?

- Brantford/Brant County residents looking for general information or community services
- Community professionals

What happens when you call? Staff will:

- Provide information about available services
- Answer your questions
- Complete an intake for referral to services that can help you
- Assist with coordination of your services

Adult developmental services provide a range of services:

- Community participation supports
- Accommodation services
- Employment services
- Respite
- Literacy supports
- Behaviour supports
- Family support
- Assessment

Community developmental services assist by providing opportunities:

- To connect to the community
- For education/skill training
- To develop life plans & pursue goals
- To develop strategies for living successfully with behavioural/mental health concerns

Contact Brant also:

- Administers the 'Passport' funding initiative for people with a developmental disability
- Coordinates a Case Resolution mechanism to address highly complex and urgent situations
- Coordinates the Residential Placement Advisory Committee (RPAC), a legislated review process for children in residential treatment
- Works with community agencies to coordinate wait lists, ensuring access to service is fair and equitable
- Serves as a resource to schools, physicians/health, and social service professionals
- Is responsible to facilitate the development of a community service plan with community organizations to identify service system gaps, successes, and areas for improvement
